

Dress Code

Guests are expected to respect the traditions of the Club and maintain exemplary standards of dress at all times. Failure to meet the dress standards will mean that you will be asked to leave the Club or the Course.

Smart casual dress maybe worn within the Clubhouse and Course at any time, subject to the following conditions:

Men

- a) **Shirts** – will be tailored ‘golf shirts’, with sleeves and free from any advertising or other slogan, apart from the accepted discreet manufactures logo and worn inside waistband.
- b) **Sweaters** – should be free from any advertising or other slogan, apart from the accepted discreet manufactures logo and worn with a shirt, as at a).
- c) **Shorts** – will be properly tailored and supported by a belt, no shorter than 3” above the knee and worn with appropriate **white ankle socks** or knee length stockings. Shorts **may not** be worn in the Clubhouse, other than the changing rooms and corridors providing access to the Course.
- d) **Trousers** – Denim jeans or similar denim wear (whatever colour), ‘combat’ style trousers with enlarged pockets and or excessive zips **may not** be worn. Plus Twos & Fours are acceptable, but not ordinary trousers tucked into socks.
- e) **Footwear** – Trainers and similar footwear **may not** be worn. Approved golfing footwear maybe worn on the Course, changing rooms and corridors proving access to the Course.
- f) **Outdoor & Waterproof clothing** – **may not** be worn in any social area of the club and must be hung in the appropriate spaces provided (outside the social areas).
- g) **Jackets, Shirts and Ties** – will be mandatory on the following occasions:
 - Presentations, unless otherwise decreed by the Captain of the day.
 - Dining Room after 7.00pm

Ladies

- a) **Shirts** – will be tailored ‘golf shirts’, free from any advertising or other slogan, apart from the accepted discreet manufactures logo and worn inside waistband, unless designed otherwise. Sun tops and tops with narrow shoulder straps are not allowed on the Course.
- b) **Sweaters** – should be free from any advertising or other slogan, apart from the accepted discreet manufactures logo and worn with a shirt, as at a).
- c) **Shorts** – properly tailored shorts, no shorter than 3” above the knee, maybe worn, except in the dining room after 5.30pm and on Sundays between 11.30am and 3.00pm.
- d) **Skirts** – should be properly tailored and not shorter than 3” above the knee.
- e) **Trousers** – Denim jeans or similar denim wear (whatever colour), ‘combat’ style trousers with enlarged pockets and or excessive zips **may not** be worn.
- f) **Footwear** – Trainers and similar footwear **may not** be worn. Approved golfing footwear maybe worn on the Course, changing rooms and corridors proving access to the Course.
- g) **Outdoor & Waterproof clothing** – **may not** be worn in any social area of the club and must be hung in the appropriate spaces provided (outside the social areas).
- h) **Major Presentations** – ladies are requested to change from golf wear

The Council has delegated sole judgement of what is acceptable to the Secretary and Steward in respect of the Clubhouse, and the Secretary and Professional in respect of the Course.
